The beloved Heritage Park koala mural is back!

It was badly damaged in a serious car accident last year. The mural had been greeting residents entering Heritage Park since its creation in the late 1980s.

Both Councillor Heremaia and the residents of Heritage Park were sad to see their old friend go.

However, Councillor Heremaia and the community worked together to make sure the local icon was restored to its former glory.

The repairs are now complete and greeting residents of Heritage Park on Bayliss Road.

The work was repainted by Council's own mural artist.

Mayor's message



The City of Logan's growth story is well known, but with this comes the delicate act of ensuring we maintain and improve our reputation as a green and sustainable city.

Becoming carbon neutral by the end of this year is a commitment Council has made to ensure we safeguard the city's future and

protect it for generations to come.

To achieve carbon neutrality, innovation is needed, and last month we made a significant inroad with the official opening of our biosolids gasification facility at the Loganholme Wastewater Treatment Plant. Logan City Council has pioneered an Australian first – a facility that transforms human waste into renewable energy and an environmentally friendly, marketable product called biochar.

Loganholme Wastewater Treatment Plant provides services to 300,000 people across the city each year. The gasifier will reduce Council's annual carbon emissions by about 6000 tonnes and save ratepayers almost \$1 million a year through cost savings and carbon credits.

Logan Water is leading the way for Australia to take a more sustainable approach to managing the 2.3 million tonnes of dewatered biosolids produced each year and already we have been approached by other utility providers looking to leverage our experience.

I truly believe our Logan Water team will be pioneers in helping the world overcome one of its biggest pollution issues.
