Armstrong Place – Loganlea Road Healthy Street Stage 2

Division 6 residents will soon have a new public space, Armstrong Place, in Meadowbrook to enjoy as part of the Loganlea Road Healthy Street project.

The vibrant community space, near Logan Hospital, will feature basketball courts, an outdoor gym, as well as gardens, shaded seating and public artwork. A futsal court and additional shade and seating will be added in early 2024.

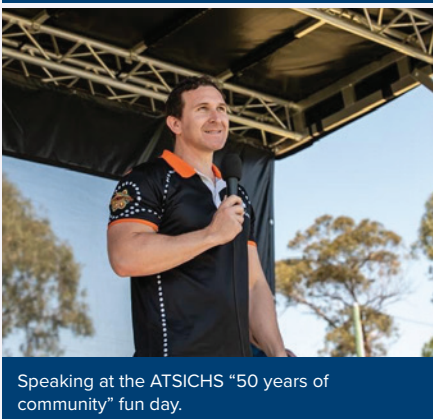

Major road upgrades this year include Loganlea Road and a road widening project at Radke Road, Bethania.

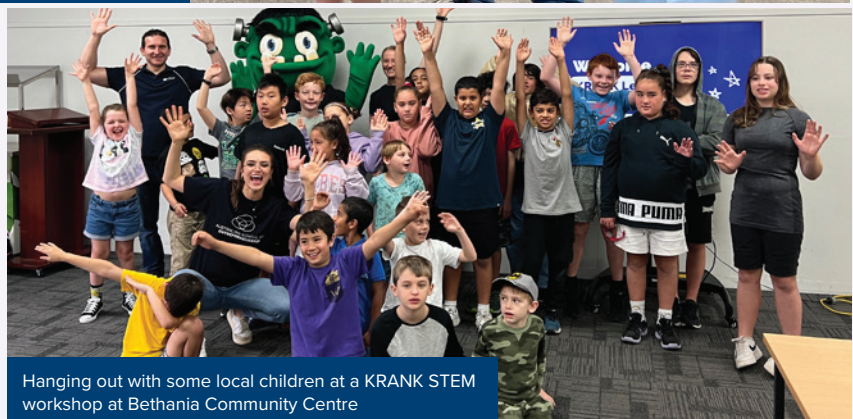

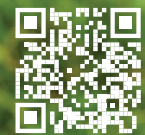
