### **Teviot Road works to start**

The Teviot Road upgrade aims to address traffic congestion and improve safety in the area. The upgrades will take place in stages.

Here are the key features of the upgrades:

- > Teviot Road will be widened to 4 lanes (2 lanes in each direction), between Greenbank Road and the Middle Road roundabout, to help accommodate increased traffic flow due to the State Government's Greater Flagstone Priority Development Area (PDA).
- > Safer intersections with new traffic lights at Greenbank Road, Leanne Court and Stoney Camp Road.

- A larger 2-lane roundabout at the intersection of Teviot Road and Middle Road, to enhance traffic flow and safety at this critical junction.
- > Pub Lane will be widened to 4 lanes (2 lanes in each direction) between Teviot Road and the Greenbank Shopping Centre roundabout.
- > Walking and bike riding facilities to improve facilities for pedestrians and cyclists, promoting active transportation and enhancing connectivity in the area.

PRARG will soon have an all-weather opportunity to show and hold their competitions, as the new \$520,000 covered arena is now a reality for Skerman Park.

The sun and weatherproof facility will be jointly funded by the Queensland Government's Minor Infrastructure Program and Logan City Council, including \$50,000 from the Division 11 Local Infrastructure Program.

This will be a huge boost for PRARG to conduct further high-level competitions that attract horses and riders with

international standings right here at PRARG, right here in Logan.

The club has a proud local history spanning more than 40 years, and it's a credit to the hard-working committee that has liaised with myself and other levels of government to achieve the club's improvement goals.

PRARG members participate in clinics and competitions for dressage, show jumping and hacking at Skerman Park, which is located on Olson Road, North Maclean.
