What are two of the key projects that your community should expect to see?

There are two projects that former Division 5 Councillor Jon Raven activated that are near completion:

- > Lighting around the lagoon at Tygum Park
- > Marsden streetscaping

Tygum Park

Solar lighting will be installed along the Tygum Lagoon Pathway in Tygum Park to provide safe walking opportunities for pedestrians in the evenings.

Specialist lighting has already been installed on the bridge over the lagoon.

The red lighting is designed for low impact on the the wildlife that call the lagoon home.

Marsden streetscaping

Browns Plains Road is currently transforming, bringing with it a pop of Pink Trumpet trees.

Building upon the success of previous streetscape upgrades along Browns Plains Road, the median enhancement will extend between between Second Avenue and Third Avenue.

I'm looking forward to working with residents to prioritise future projects.
