## Road upgrades underway

Upgrades to Teviot Road are well underway.

The widening of the road and other improvements are part of a multi-staged upgrade to our local road network.

There is still much to do and I recognise the impact these works have on our daily travel plans as the road crews go about constructing these new and safer roads.

I thank you for your patience as the years of planning and budgeting come to realisation which, ultimately, will benefit us all.

For those new to the area, this project aims to address traffic congestion and improve safety.

Here are the key features of the upgrade that will be delivered across a staged process:

- > **Widening Teviot Road:** The road will be widened to 4 lanes (2 lanes in each direction) between Greenbank Road and the Middle Road roundabout. This expansion will help accommodate increased traffic flow due to residential and business growth in the region.
- > **Larger roundabout:** A larger 2-lane roundabout will be constructed at the intersection of Teviot and Middle Roads. This improvement will enhance traffic flow and safety at this critical junction.
- > **Intersection upgrades:** The intersections at Stoney Camp

Road, Leanne Court, Pub Lane, and Greenbank Road will be upgraded. These enhancements will contribute to smoother traffic movements and reduce congestion.

- > **Pub Lane widening:** Pub Lane will be widened to 4 lanes (2 lanes in each direction) between Teviot Road and the Greenbank Shopping Centre roundabout.
- > **Walking and bike riding facilities:** I am advocating for these projects to also include improved facilities for pedestrians and cyclists, promoting active transportation and enhancing connectivity in the area.

## Mayor's message



I've got some exciting news for our city. We've just announced an amazing new project in Logan – and the Expressions of Interest for a company to build it are officially open.

If you haven't already heard about the Logan Indoor Sports Centre, it's a multi-purpose indoor sports facility that our growing city needs, which is being built to an Olympic standard so that it can be used if needed when the Games arrive in 2032.

It's exactly what our fast-growing city needs, because facilities like this inspire young people to reach for the stars. This venue can host a range of sports, para sports and large-scale events, and host 7,000 people inside.

Three levels of government have come together to make this happen. At a cost of \$142 million dollars, it's being jointly funded by the Australian and Queensland governments, with Council providing the land.

The facility will be owned and operated by Logan City Council and is sure to become a beacon for state, national and international sports and events. It's going to be built where the old PCYC is – close to the Logan Entertainment Centre as a great addition to our fantastic events hub.

I'm grateful to local state MPs Linus Power and Cameron Dick, as well as Federal Treasurer Jim Chalmers and Minister for Infrastructure Catherine King, for coming along to the announcement in Logan Central. Hats off to them for recognising the limitless potential of Logan.

Investment like this is exactly what we need to create a brighter future for our kids. With 9 indoor courts across 2 halls, this will leave a legacy from the 2032 Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games to benefit our community for decades to come.
