Every month, I get to meet an impounded dog and get the opportunity to take them out to one of the many awesome off-leash parks in Division 4.

Getting these pets out for some exercise and socialising with other dogs is important.

It also provides an opportunity to film and create content to share with

the community with the intention of finding them 'forever' homes.

All the furry legends that I have featured on my Facebook page so far have found new homes.

Council's refurbished \$21 million state-of-the-art AMC provides high-quality care for lost pets and other domestic animals.

The facility has a priority focus on disease management and our growing community needs.

Among many new features, the AMC boasts a ducted air-conditioned and individually ventilated multi-level cat housing area while dogs are kept

in large pens with fully-grassed, individual outdoor yards.

Council is working to rehome as many pets as possible through our successful animal adoption program. Last year alone, the program helped 471 animals find a new home.

The Logan Village Services Club is set to undergo a significant transformation with a new deck extension for its headquarters at Merv and Ollie Musch Park.

This new deck will be a great spot for community events and gatherings and will provide another versatile outdoor space that benefits everyone in the community.

The Club deck extension project is funded by the Division 4 Local Infrastructure Program.

The Logan Village Services Club has always been a place where veterans can find friendship and support local community.

The deck extension will enhance this experience by providing a comfortable and welcoming environment for them to gather and share their important stories.

Mayor's message



I hope you had a safe and happy Easter.

Can you believe it's been just over a year since your Councillors and I were elected?

It's been an incredibly busy time and the recent public holidays were a good chance to reflect on what's been achieved.

Some great news for Logan is that our new 9-court Indoor Sports Centre will start construction later this year and is due to be finished by 2028. This is a \$140m project funded jointly by the Queensland and Australian Governments and has been identified as a potential event venue at the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

We also recently completed an \$80 million upgrade of Loganlea Road.

This project, which included widening the road to 3 lanes in both directions and adding infrastructure, was funded with the support of Jim Chalmers MP as part of the 2022 Federal Election.

Council is now in the middle of finalising the upcoming budget. Your Councillors are focused on finding savings and improving efficiencies across all areas. But just like you, Council is struggling with significant increases in costs for the city – particularly fuel, electricity, insurances and construction.

We're also working on a community consultation project called Transform Logan. During my election campaign, locals said they wanted their Mayor to focus on better long-term planning and an ambitious vision for our city.

This community reference panel has 50 representatives looking at what the next 50 years looks like for Logan. They will share their ideas later in the year.
