## Intersection upgrade outside Logan Reserve school

Construction designs for an upgrade to the busy intersection of Logan Reserve Road and School Road have been completed.

Much-needed traffic lights and a signalised pedestrian crossing will be installed. The road pavement will be resurfaced and new line markings will be added.

These important works will improve the safety for drivers and pedestrians and particularly those local families

who regularly travel to and from Logan Reserve State School.

Local residents have let me know about the urgent need for this upgrade.

Once funding was secured I began working hard to have the upgrade delivered as a priority.

The project is being funded and delivered by Logan City Council with the support of the Australian

Government's Black Spot Program.

The next steps for this project include Department of Transport and Main Road approval before construction can begin.

## Resurfacing works are underway on more local roads

As our neighbourhoods grow, our local roads are subject to increasing amounts of traffic each year.

It is essential that these roads are maintained and upgraded.

So far more than 2,532 square metres of patching work was completed along School, Bumstead and Green roads.

We have been successful in securing additional resurfacing works for Green Road and Bumstead Road. A new bitumen surface will be put down on other sections of both these busy thoroughfares, with completion scheduled in 2026.

Keeping the roads in good condition and able to manage daily traffic flow is important for our area.

These upgrade works will help keep our roads safe, smooth and durable.

Improving road surfaces and making it safer for the thousands of motorists who use these busy roads every day remains a top priority.

## New safety fence installed after mobile office chat

A new safety fence has been installed adjacent to a drainage culvert along Logan Reserve Road.

The fence has created a safe barrier for pedestrians and cyclists, including children, who use the concrete footpath to access nearby parks.

The project included the installation of 8 metres of fencing which helps prevent anyone from

accidentally slipping into the concrete culvert.

This positive outcome was the result of residents raising their concerns with me about the area during a mobile office that I hosted recently on Logan Reserve Road.

So a big thank you goes to our local community for helping drive this important safety improvement.

## Parks upgraded with lighting

New lights have been installed at 2 popular Division 8 parks.

The works were done at East Beaumont Park in Park Ridge and Walkabout Park in Chambers Flat, after residents let me know about the need for better lighting when we chatted at my recent mobile offices.

The East Beaumont Park upgrade features 60 metres of footpath lighting and 3 new light poles.

At Walkabout Park, a solar panel on top of the pole powers the new light.

This upgrade makes both parks more accessible, safer and enjoyable to use, particularly for residents who enjoy walking, jogging or exercising in the early mornings or evenings.

The works at both these parks were funded by the Division 8 Local Infrastructure Program.

## Mayor's message



We all live in Logan for a reason – whether it's backyards and big dreams, great parks and schools, community spirit or affordability.

Council works with the community to protect what we love and transform areas that still need work.

We've wrapped up 9 weeks of community consultation on Logan Plan – the blueprint for where homes, jobs, industry and community facilities go, and how we keep our community spirit as we grow.

You asked us to cut red tape and make it easier to buy a home, so we've proposed terrace housing, giving first-home buyers and downsizers more options. We also flagged ecotourism opportunities and practical ways to boost our nighttime economy, so our suburbs feel safe and welcoming after dark.

We heard your concerns about flood mapping loud and clear. Your Councillors and I are working with staff on solutions based on your feedback. This is long-term policy, so we need to get it right before the flood maps become permanent. We're starting with changes to the flood portal, and also want to change policies and improve the mapping.

Council will consider every submission, report back to Councillors, and provide a response to every submission through the *Logan Plan - Public Consultation Report 2025*. Parts of the draft may be revised, then the State Government will review it. If approved, Logan Plan is expected to come into effect in late 2026.

Thank you to all who had a say. You're helping shape the city our kids will inherit. If you didn't have a chance to make a submission, I am always open to hearing your ideas and suggestions.

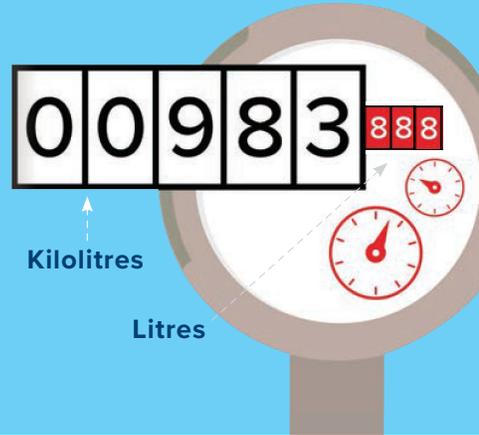
Council will keep refining Logan Plan and our vision for the next 50 years with your help. Logan's future is bright because we're building it together.

# Avoid a leak, take a peek!

1. Turn off all taps and water-using appliances in the property.
2. Is there any movement in the red digits or dials of your water meter? Any movement may indicate a leak.
3. To check – read your meter and record the number, keep your taps and water using appliances off for one hour. Read your meter again, record the second reading. If the reading has changed, this may indicate a leak. We suggest contacting a registered plumber to investigate further.
