## Gearing up: Trail improvements progressing in Cornubia Forest

There is great news for our local riders and outdoor enthusiasts, with plans for the Ginger Gully trail extension in Cornubia Forest Park now approved, paving the way for an important upgrade to our much-loved trail network.

Submitted by Logan Community TrailCare Alliance (LCTA) Cornubia TrailCare, the proposal will help guide the project which will be delivered in conjunction with Logan City Council.

The first phase of work will focus on realigning the Ginger Gully section

affected by the installation of the new Fire Access Line.

This portion of the trail runs from Boxer Avenue to Cycas Court, continuing up toward the escarpment.

Realignment will improve safety, manage erosion and ensure this popular section remains enjoyable for riders into the future.

Following a well-deserved summer break, TrailCare working bees will resume this autumn with sessions planned across April and May (and beyond).

The team will also undertake an inspection of an existing non-sanctioned trail in order to assess future possibilities and environmental considerations.

Works will continue through 2026 with a Trail Network Plan being prepared to help shape the future of the Cornubia Forest trail network.

## Mayor's message



Did you hear the big news? Amazon Australia is coming to Logan.

A new \$750 million robotics fulfilment centre will be built at North Maclean, creating more than 2,000 jobs during construction and fit-out, and around 1,000 ongoing jobs for people in our community once it's up and running.

Plans have been revealed for the four-level facility, which is set to cover about 150,000 square metres. That's almost twice the size of Suncorp Stadium.

When it's operating at full capacity, the centre will process more than 125 million packages a year and hold up to 15 million items ready to ship. With advanced AI and automation, that means faster delivery for customers right across Queensland.

The City of Logan is the perfect place for a company like Amazon to invest. We're the youngest and fastest growing city in Queensland, and many in our community want the opportunity to work closer to home.

Local jobs mean less traffic on our roads and more time with family.

I also love how Amazon's robotic warehouses combine technology and people. The technology handles the heavy lifting and repetitive tasks, while people focus on the work that requires skill, judgement and experience.

Your Councillors and I believe it's important that high-paying technology jobs are created right here in Logan. It's something many of you told me you wanted when I was running for Mayor.

Amazon joins big names like Toyota, Culture Kings, LSKD and Little Red Dumpling which have already invested in Logan's bright future. They know what we know. Logan is the place to be.

The Amazon fulfilment centre is expected to be completed in 2028.
