Pickleball facility helps Greenbank lead the way on a fun new sport

Australia's first pickleball courts purpose-built to international standards have been constructed in Greenbank.

The facilities have been installed by developer Mirvac in the Everleigh estate.

They include a show court and 2 tennis courts that can be converted into 2 volleyball courts or a further 8 pickleball courts if needed.

Logan City Council contributed \$1.1 million through its Sports Infrastructure Program while lighting, court surface upgrades, additional fencing and line marking were funded by the Division 11 Local Infrastructure Program.

Pickleball is one of Australia's fastest growing racquet sports with more than 155,000 players now registered across the country.

There has been considerable growth of this new sport in recent years and I am thrilled to be supporting this wave of participation and interest with these latest courts.

The new courts are significant because they are not just re-purposed tennis courts but have been purpose-built to international standard for multiple sports.

This is just a start and I look forward to supporting further growth in the sport with this new local facility and hosting many tournaments.

Pickleball was introduced to Australia in 2015 with the first dedicated courts created in Queensland. It is played on a court smaller than tennis with participants using a simple paddle and a wiffle ball.

Pickleball Australia Executive Officer Brendan Lee says the Greenbank facility is an exciting project as it brings the sport right into a local suburb for everyone to enjoy.

'Pickleball is accessible for all ages with last year's Australian titles contested by players ranging in age from 8 to 92 years old,' Brendan says.

Traffic lights will make intersection safer

Work has started on a new and safer intersection for Homestead Drive, Teviot Road, and Glynton Road at Flagstone.

This much-anticipated upgrade project will include realigning Homestead Drive, Teviot Road and Glynton Road to form a new, signalised intersection with additional turning and through lanes.

There will be a new left-turn slip lane from Homestead Drive onto Teviot Road, a connection with the new Teviot Road extension to the south, a new centre median, bike lanes and concrete paths on part of Homestead Drive.

I am certain the new additions and upgrades will be welcomed by the many Division 11 residents who use these thoroughfares regularly.

The long-awaited all-weather arena for the Park Ridge Adult Riding Group (PRARG) at Skerman Park in North Maclean has now been completed and is being used by the club.

It was a pleasure to attend the official opening recently to celebrate with PRARG President Kay Paulsen and other hard-working committee members who helped turn this dream into a reality.

The all-weather arena provides the opportunity to host their competitions under a new \$928,000 covered space.

The facility was jointly funded by the Queensland Government's Minor Infrastructure Program and Logan City Council, including \$50,000 from the Division 11 Local Infrastructure Program.

This will be a huge boost for PRARG to conduct further competitions at the highest level and attract horses and riders with international standings right here in Logan.

The club has a proud history that spans more than 40 years.

It is a credit to the club's amazing committee members who have liaised with me and other levels of Government to achieve their long-standing goal of upgrading their home arena.

PRARG members participate in clinics and competitions for dressage, show jumping and hack.

Did you hear the big news? Amazon Australia is coming to Logan.

A new \$750 million robotics fulfilment centre will be built at North Maclean, creating more than 2,000 jobs during construction and fit-out, and around 1,000 ongoing jobs for people in our community once it's up and running.

Plans have been revealed for the four-level facility, which is set to cover about 150,000 square metres. That's almost twice the size of Suncorp Stadium.

When it's operating at full capacity, the centre will process more than 125 million packages a year and hold up to 15 million items ready to ship. With advanced AI and automation, that means faster delivery for customers right across Queensland.

The City of Logan is the perfect place for a company like Amazon to invest. We're the youngest and fastest growing city in Queensland, and many in our community want the opportunity to work closer to home.

Local jobs mean less traffic on our roads and more time with family.

I also love how Amazon's robotic warehouses combine technology and people. The technology handles the heavy lifting and repetitive tasks, while people focus on the work that requires skill, judgement and experience.

Your Councillors and I believe it's important that high-paying technology jobs are created right here in Logan. It's something many of you told me you wanted when I was running for Mayor.

The Amazon fulfilment centre is expected to be completed in 2028.
