From drab to fab as park completed

Division 6's ducks really are in a row when it comes to great urban design.

Ducks are just some of the birds flocking to the completed and wonderful Sturdee Park drain naturalisation project in Loganlea.

They have been spotted drinking and bathing in the water in the park after its \$1.95 million transformation from a boring concrete drain to an environmentally-friendly waterway.

Other creatures have benefitted, too. Lizards looking for sun can stretch out on some of the old concrete from the

380m-long drain we've repurposed as basking rocks.

There are 2 ponds in the park and native plants line the water's edge.

Locals can enjoy the view in a nicer environment with seating dotted around the park.

I'm so glad this work is completed and I thank the Queensland Government for giving it a funding boost via the South-East Queensland Community Stimulus Program.

I'm told it's the first time this type of

work has been delivered in the City of Logan. It's awesome to be leading the way in Division 6.

Waste changes coming

From July 1, Division 6 residents who use Beenleigh Waste and Recycling Facility will have to use the Browns Plains, Logan Village or Carbrook facilities to dispose of general waste.

Domestic green waste, recyclables, batteries and e-waste will continue to be accepted at the Beenleigh facility.

This change is being made because the Beenleigh site cannot be expanded and it regularly experiences congestion and queuing which can be a safety risk for staff and community members.

Did you hear the big news? Amazon Australia is coming to Logan.

A new \$750 million robotics fulfilment

centre will be built at North Maclean, creating more than 2,000 jobs during construction and fit-out, and around 1,000 ongoing jobs for people in our community once it's up and running.

Plans have been revealed for the four-level facility, which is set to cover about 150,000 square metres. That's almost twice the size of Suncorp Stadium.

When it's operating at full capacity, the centre will process more than 125 million packages a year and hold up to 15 million items ready to ship. With advanced AI and automation, that means faster delivery for customers right across Queensland.

The City of Logan is the perfect place for a company like Amazon to invest. We're the youngest and fastest growing city in Queensland, and many in our community want the opportunity to work closer to home.

Local jobs mean less traffic on our roads and more time with family.

I also love how Amazon's robotic warehouses combine technology and people. The technology handles the heavy lifting and repetitive tasks, while people focus on the work that requires skill, judgement and experience.

Your Councillors and I believe it's important that high-paying technology jobs are created right here in Logan. It's something many of you told me you wanted when I was running for Mayor.

Amazon joins big names like Toyota, Culture Kings, LSKD and Little Red Dumpling which have already invested in Logan's bright future. They know what we know. Logan is the place to be.

The Amazon fulfilment centre is expected to be completed in 2028.
